



The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The 30 hours of electives within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours; please see [JCCC A.A. degree requirements](#). Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.

Requirements for Admission for Elementary Education K-6 Majors:

1. Complete the application for admission to Teacher Education.
2. Be recommended for Teacher Education by advisor, Exploration in Education or Transfer Student Module instructor and two college instructors.
3. Meet the basic skills requirement with a minimum ACT composite score of 22 OR CORE Writing 162, Reading 156 and Math 142. (Other basic skills options may be available by petition.)
4. Complete EDUC 261 or equivalent with a minimum grade of "C" and a positive recommendation for continuance from the cooperative school-based teacher.
5. Complete EDUC 345 Transfer Student Module (for students transferring credit for EDUC 161).
6. Complete General Education Core Curriculum with a minimum GPA of 2.80. The Core Curriculum includes: COMM 207, ENGL 101, ENGL 299, MATH 204, BIOL 113, PHYS 171/172, POLS 101, GEOG 106, PSYCH 155, HHP 150, HIST 201 or HIST 202.
7. Have a cumulative GPA of at least a 2.80.
8. Complete a statement of disclosure and background check.
9. Complete electronic portfolio requirements.
10. Complete the teacher candidate interview.
11. Complete the critical learning experience essay.
12. The minimum requirements for graduation include: 126 credit hours; 60 credit hours must be from a four-year school. In addition, a minimum of 45 credit hours must be upper-division and a minimum of 30 hours must be in residence at Pitt State.
13. The Pitt State Pathway requirements consist of 40-41 credit hours of course work. All baccalaureate students must successfully pass these requirements. Courses meeting Pitt State Pathway requirements may also satisfy major, minor, emphasis or program requirements.
14. Suggested courses are bolded below. In addition, please review the Academic Advising Planning Document for details on the Pitt State Pathway rules and requirements.
